CRPUD Trimming Trees Throughout Its Service Area

Columbia River PUD will be pruning and removing vegetation throughout its service territory, in accordance with the Public Utility Commission clearance requirements.

Vegetation management is important to minimize wildfire risk, increase public safety, and maintain safe and reliable electric service.

You may see Columbia River PUD crews or contracted Asplundh crews trimming and clearing vegetation near power lines. You will receive an automated phone call before they start working in your area. Please call the PUD at (503) 397-1844 if you have any concerns.
